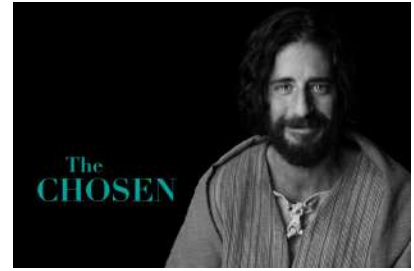


The CHOSEN

INTRODUCTION

Season 1 Episode 3: “Jesus Loves The Little Children” Jesus befriends and teaches the group of children who discover His camp on the outskirts of Capernaum.

POSSIBLE QUESTIONS

1. Which characters or scenes stood out to you the most? Which were the most interesting?
2. We saw Jesus building a fire, cooking, washing his feet, sleeping, waking up, praying, singing, working, washing, and playing with children. What was it like to experience the humanity of Jesus on display? Is it strange for you to think of Jesus as personable?
3. Why do you think Jesus welcomed these children? How does this help you to understand how much He desires to welcome you?
4. In this episode Jesus is seen praying routinely (mealtimes, bedtime) and passionately. What is your prayer life like? How does this portrayal of Jesus’ prayers encourage you?
5. Was your relationship with Jesus different from when you were a child? What changed?
6. Jesus says we must “change and become like little children” in order to enter heaven. What does he mean by that?
7. What can you do more in your life to become more like a “little child”?
8. How did Jesus’ treatment of the children impact you?
9. Jesus’ response to some of the children’s questions seemed evasive or incomplete. Why do you think that is? And how does this relate to His responses to our questions? Ex: One child, Joshua, asked “Is your father rich?” Jesus answered, “That is a question for another time.”

SCRIPTURE & PRAYER

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 “Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 5 You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. 6 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. 7 You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.
