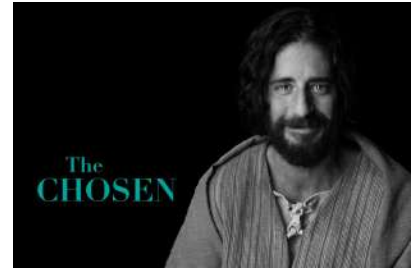

INTRODUCTION

Season 1 Episode 3: “Jesus Loves The Little Children” Jesus befriends and teaches the group of children who discover His camp on the outskirts of Capernaum.

POSSIBLE QUESTIONS

1. Which characters or scenes stood out to you the most? Which were the most interesting?
2. Why do you think the creators of The Chosen devoted a whole episode to Jesus interacting with children?
3. How can you be more attentive and affectionate toward the children in your home, church, and neighborhood, like Jesus?
4. What worthy characteristics did we see exhibited in the children that we could grow in?
5. The children seemed to be very well trained in their Jewish faith / tradition. Do you think our children today understand our faith as well as these children?
6. Jesus seemed to be extremely comfortable with the children. He treated them as special people. Their experience with Jesus will be a cherished memory, a life altering event. Do you have childhood memories of an adult taking the time to treat you with respect and sharing with you wisdom that you have carried with you as you matured?
7. Jesus’ gift reminded Abigail that He did not come only for the wealthy. How does that make you feel about Jesus? What does that mean about how we as His disciples treat people?
8. Jesus was both playful and purposeful as He related to the children. What does that say about how God relates to us?

SCRIPTURE & PRAYER

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 “Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 5 You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. 6 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. 7 You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.
